




2024 Endowment Update

We welcomed eight new endowed scholarships and added over \$320,000 to the endowment in 2024.









2024 Scholarship Statistics


Scholarships Awarded by Degree




Scholarships Awarded by Race/Ethnicity




Age of Scholarship Recipients


Event Highlights

We are honored to host two of our community's most anticipated annual events. In 2024, we celebrated the 32nd Annual Salute to Women of Achievement, recognizing 75 extraordinary women who have made significant contributions to our community professionally, civically, and philanthropically. This prestigious recognition has become one of the area's most coveted professional honors and was held in a sold-out venue with over 1,400 guests in attendance.

2024 also marked the 17th Annual Power of the Purse, Thanks to the generosity of the Nevada Women's Fund Board of Directors, who donated over \$32,000 worth of purses, the event was a record-breaking success and an unforgettable night.

These signature events, along with the annual contributions from our board, cover nearly 100% of Nevada Women's Fund's operating expenses, ensuring that every dollar donated can go directly toward our mission—empowering women to achieve their full potential through education and career advancement opportunities!

Nevada Women's Fund 2024 Operating Income













Women in the Trades

Nevada's leading industries: tourism, agriculture, manufacturing, and mining create a high demand for skilled trades in our state, compounding the need to empower women to pursue diverse career paths. It would be a disservice to future generations if we do not foster conversation and offer support that will allow women to envision and achieve professional success in ANY industry.

Nevada Women's Fund currently has four trade-specific scholarships to be awarded annually, supporting women in fields such as welding, construction, automotive technology, and culinary arts. By empowering women to enter traditionally male-dominated industries, we help them succeed and also enable them to become role models, inspiring others to explore non-traditional careers and defy gender stereotypes.

Donor Highlights

Mae Sagawa Sheffon

Mae Sagawa Shelton was a lifelong advocate for women, children, and underserved communities in Nevada. As Director of Washoe County Social Services for 20 years, she shaped policies that improved the lives of vulnerable populations. She led efforts to secure stable funding for child protective services, reduce child abuse reports, and expand healthcare access for indigent families. Even after retiring in 2000, Mae continued her advocacy as a lobbyist and volunteer. She served on numerous nonprofit boards, including the Nevada Women's Fund, where she chaired the Board in 1991 and remained involved for decades.

Mae's commitment to Nevada Women's Fund was transformative. She worked tirelessly to raise funds for scholarships and programs, helping women in Northern Nevada pursue academic and professional goals. Her contributions earned numerous awards, including the NWF Chairman's Award (1994), induction into the NWF Hall of Fame (2001) and the NWF Honorary Council (2004).

In a final act of generosity, Mae helped establish the Jan Evans Memorial Scholarship Fund in honor of her friend Jan Evans, a passionate advocate for domestic violence survivors and education. The fund, administered by Nevada Women's Fund, supports single mothers studying education at the University of Nevada, continuing Mae's legacy of empowering women.

The project not only empowers the women involved but also inspires others to embrace their individuality and strength.

They are donating 100% of the proceeds from the 40 Over 40 Book to this scholarship, which supports women over 40 seeking to return to school, particularly those who have faced financial challenges. This initiative reflects their dedication to uplifting women and providing opportunities for personal and professional growth.

Amber and Scotti also generously provide photography at Nevada Women's Fund special events and Amber serves as a Community Member for the organization. Through both their artistry and philanthropy, Amber and Scotti have become influential figures in the community, using their talents to make a meaningful impact and inspire others to embrace their own potential.
