




Mission & Impact


Karyn Jensen

1996 Scholarship Recipent

Karyn Jensen received a Nevada Women's Fund scholarship in 1996 while making a weekly four-hour round trip commute from Reno to Sacramento and working full-time to obtain a Master of Science degree in Human Resources.

In 2005 Karyn founded Human Resource Connection and has since assisted more than 300 local companies with their HR needs.

Currently, Karyn is the Professional Development Chair and past President for the Northern Nevada Human Resource Association (NNHRA) and a member of the Society for Human Resource Management. She was also an instructor, facilitator, and program developer for University of Nevada, Reno Extended Studies beginning in 1991, and is currently pursuing training and speaking opportunities which incorporate her vast knowledge of human resources, leadership, and more.





How you can support the Nevada Women's Fund Scholarship program:

Endowed Scholarship: Establish an endowed scholarship with \$10,000 to provide scholarships in your name or in the name of someone you wish to honor in perpetuity! You have 5 years to raise the initial \$10,000 and may contribute further at any time.

Annual Scholarship: Create an annual scholarship in your name or in the name of someone you wish to honor with a contribution of at least \$2,000 annually.

Sharon Malotte

1987-1988 Scholarship Recipient

Dr. Malotte is a member of the TeMoak Band of Western Shoshones of the South Fork Indian Reservation, and was the first indigenous Nevadan to become a doctor. She was also named Miss Indian Nevada 1977. As a woman who overcame significant difficulties to become a successful physician, she is a role model for students and her own two daughters, Bhie-Cie Naïve and Darcy Rose.

Dr. Malotte served as medical director of the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribal Health Clinic in Schurz, providing care to the people of the reservation as the only family practice specialist. She also worked in the ER at the South Lyon Medical Center in Yerington.

She is a member of the Association of American Indian Physicians and has served as a Native American Representative to the Committee of Minority Affairs Consortium of the American Medical Association. She is now retired from medicine but continues to be a proud role model. She is currently the EMS Director for the Yerington Fire Dept. and continues making a difference, "by being an identifiable minority person, with a high profile, and being a person that others can identify with."

Mariluz Garcia

2005-2006 Scholarship Recipient

Born and raised in Elko Nevada, Mariluz moved to Reno to attend University of Nevada, Reno where she received not one but three degrees including her Ph.D. in Equity & Diversity in Education. Mariluz went on to work as a middle school counselor in the Washoe County School District and was named a Nevada Women's Fund Salute to Women of Achievement Honoree in 2017. Mariluz founded the Nevada First-Gen Network and is the Executive Director of Dean's Future Scholars at University of Nevada, Reno. In 2022 she was elected to the Washoe County Board of Commissioners District 3.

Mariluz is a shining example of the legacies being created by Nevada Women's Fund scholarship recipients. In honor of these collective achievements, we've asked Mariluz to be the 2023 Event Chair at our Salute to Women of Achievement celebration on May 25, 2023.
