





Beverly Ann Colgan, Professional Harpist

Beverly Ann Colgan received Nevada Women's Fund Scholarships in 1988 and 1989. She was Principal Harpist with the Nevada Opera, the Reno Philharmonic, and the Nevada Festival Ballet. She has performed for Luciano Pavarotti, Frank Sinatra, Loretta Lynn, Sammy Davis, Jr., Toni Tenille, and many other visiting artists. She is a soloist and former Principal Harpist with the Reno Chamber Orchestra, and teaches harp.



Rebecca Judd, Broadway Star

Rebecca Judd received scholarships from Nevada Women's Fund in 1986 and 1987 and is an actresssinger and has appeared on Broadway as Mdm. Giry in "The Phantom of the Opera". She has toured Internationally as Sarah Brown in "Guys and Dolls". Her regional credits include Maggie Jones in "42nd Street" and the Beggar Woman in "Sweeney Todd".

Judge Cheri Emm-Smith received a Nevada Women's Fund Scholarship in 1985. She earned a graduate degree from the University of Nevada, Reno, and Arizona State University, College of Law. She is presently serving as Verington Municipal Court Judge, as well as engaged in private practice. Cheri has served as District Attorney of Mineral County and Deputy District Attorney of Churchill County. In addition to that she wears another hat, she owns a ranch in Lyon County and proudly calls herself a "farmer."

Megan received Nevada Women's Fund Scholarships in 2018, 2019 and 2021. She graduated from UNR with her degree in Medicine and is currently a Pediatric Resident Physician at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland. Her interests are in pediatric advocacy, substance use education and prevention, and underserved populations. As a medical student, she has served as the district representative for the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and is currently on the Nevada Board for the AAP. In addition to advocacy, she has worked with the National Institutes of Health on various projects in the field of Endocrinology and has developed a substance use and addiction curriculum for high school health classes in Washoe County School District.

\$114,000 in Academic Scholarships


25% of NWF's 2023 scholarship funding was awarded to women living and educating in rural Nevada communities. NWF is working with educators, corporate partners, industry professionals, employers & local municipalities to expand its reach and impact.

\$25,000 Grant

NWF granted \$25,000 to the Carson City non-profit FISH to support housing for women in the newly built FISH Family Student Housing Project. The project aims to provide students with the chance to finish their education without the financial strain of housing expenses. This initiative empowers women to enhance their earning potential, uplifts families from generational poverty, and contributes to the overall strength of communities.
